A Year In Review

In January 2014, your leadership set the following lofty goals on behalf of the membership: (1) information sharing with MiRealSource; (2) an end to the ongoing class action law suit; (3) a commercial overlay and stronger commercial presence; (4) more Affiliate membership and (5) more community involvement as a Board.

We also set the following long term missions for your association:

(1) The continued economic health of the Board; (2) increased membership; (3) improved educational and ethical standards; (4) increased membership satisfaction and (5) the protection of real estate broker's and agent's occupation and rights.

I give us an A- on both our goals and pursuing our missions.

First, we did manage to settle the class action lawsuit involving Realcomp. Over the course of several years, the issue of access to our collective works has been debated. We managed to work with counsel to settle the litigation as affordably as we could. Remember that this year's Board was more than a little pregnant with this subject and worked at length to resolve the matter. By settling the litigation in the manner in which we did, we also maintained the mission of continuing the economic health of the Board.

Second, through the monumental efforts of Pat Jacobs, and her staff, Millie, Tonya and

Janet, even during this time of turmoil, NOCBOR has sustained extraordinary growth. Our membership is going to eclipse 3500 and will be approaching 4000 early in 2015. This is a combination of increases in both Affiliate and Broker members.

Third, we had our first Commercial Committee meeting and it was a success! The Commercial Committee was formed early in the year and it has already had an impact. At a recent Realcomp Shareholders' meeting, the Commercial Committee at NOCBOR managed to get an agenda item added requesting that we create a CMLS. In response, a focus group is being created to discuss rules and fields that are useful to better serve the commercial practitioner.

Fourth, 2014 was a year in which NOCBOR offered more education to its members for free than ever before! The teachers of the sophisticated subject matters remain the best available in the industry.

Fifth, we held our first ever town hall forum on the critical issue of our time. We believe this was essential to educate and activate our base. We are in a time where we need to protect real estate brokers and agents alike from the ever increasing intrusion of large corporate interests!

Sixth, NAR established a new Core Standards package. I am proud to say that NOCBOR is one of the few Boards in the country that meets the new standards in just about every metric. That being said, we continue to lead the way in professional standards. This is why we are seen as the preferred strategic partner by many other Associations in the state.

Finally, we continued our unique community involvement through our Government Affairs Committee. The largest Committee by far at NOCBOR continues to get attention by influential people in the US government as well as the local municipalities. It is well documented by other Associations that but for the efforts of NOCBOR no agents could make protected commissions on Tax Sales of property.

The only reason I believe we get a mark against us is not accomplishing our goal of sharing information with MiRealSource. This could not be a full grade reduction however, because of the efforts made. We have looked deep into the GLR and other methods to share.

MiRealSource will not share directly with Realcomp as other MLS systems do across the state. The controls offered by the GLR were not adequate to protect our members' data integrity and it was potentially dangerous to the membership's careers. Our mission tenants always take precedent over our short term goals.

The good news is the Board is full of competent, engaging, interested agents and brokers that are looking out for you! R.W. Watson is as effective and conscientious President as you could hope for. I believe I have made my love for your EVP Pat Jacobs as plain as can be.

Thank you once again for the opportunity to help this Association. I will forever be grateful for the energy my fellow Board members put into the projects I asked them to consider. This is an all-volunteer Board but you would never know it given their commitment.

I want to also, again, thank my parents, for involving me in real estate early in life. I still have not found a career as fulfilling as brokering real estate. It is emotional, dramatic, demanding and rewarding both economically and socially. I love bringing people together, especially when we can create something lasting.

Legal Q & A

- **Q:** Prior to their death, my parents deeded their cabin to my brother and me as "joint tenants with rights of survivorship." Can I deed my interest in the cabin to my daughter?
- A: Yes, but your daughter's interest in the cabin will automatically terminate upon your death unless you outlive your brother.
- Q: The buyer's lender has requested a copy of the seller's disclosure statement and the lead based paint disclosure. Am I legally required to give copies of these documents to the bank?
- **A:** The buyer's lender can certainly require these documents as a condition of making the loan.
- **Q:** I have a prospective buyer who is Hispanic. He told me that he wants to live in a "Hispanic neighborhood." What can I do about this?
- A: This client needs to be told that it is illegal for you to direct him/her to particular neighborhoods based upon ethnicity or nationality of the residents in that neighborhood.
- *Q:* I am a REALTOR® that owns some investment property that I plan on leasing. I am concerned about prospective tenants that own pets and the damage that may result. I wish to protect myself by charging the usual deposit of 1 ½ month's rent, plus an additional pet deposit. Is this allowed?
- A: No. Under Michigan law, the total security deposit amount may not exceed $1\frac{1}{2}$ month's rent. MCL 554.602. A landlord can charge increased rent to tenants who have pets.
- **Q:** I am a REALTOR® representing a licensed builder who is selling a house that he has built. The builder currently resides in this property. Is he exempt from the Seller Disclosure Act?
- A: No. The builder would have been exempt from the Seller Disclosure Act had he not resided in the property. Section 565.953(i) exempts a transfer from a licensed builder ONLY if it is a newly constructed residential property that has not been previously inhabited. (This column is provided by the law firm of McClelland & Anderson)

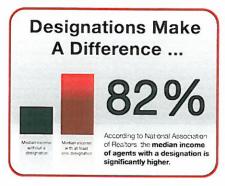

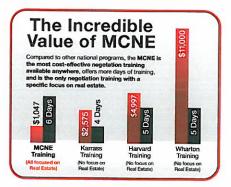
